A striking and very unique French 19th century Louis XVI st. ormolu, silvered bronze and crystal chandelier possibly by Lalique. The chandelier is centered by a bottom ormolu tassel which connects to the top tied bow and ring design. At the center are three silvered bronze torches bound together by finely detailed foliate and fabric designs. Each display their original beautiful crystal covers.

Lalique is a French glassmaker, founded by renowned glassmaker and jeweler René Lalique in 1888. Lalique is best known for producing glass art, including perfume bottles, vases, and hood ornaments during the early twentieth century. Following the death of René, Lalique transitioned to producing lead glass (crystal) works during the 1950s while under the direction of René's son, Marc Lalique.
